6/7-9 Golden West Fly-in & Air show **Marysville, CA**

Celebrating the 70th Anniversary of the Marysville Army Airfield.

7/20-21 Royal International Air Tattoo **RAF Fairford, UK**

The world's largest military air show. One of the UK's top outdoor family events.

7/29-8/4 EAA AirVenture Oshkosh

Wittman Regional Airport, Oshkosh, WI
Famous for over 500,000 visitors and massive fly-in of aircraft. Multiple displays as well as talks by influential people in aviation.

8/9-11 Abbotsford Air show **Abbotsford, BC**

Canada's largest air show/aviation festival.

8/15-18 Airbourne 2013 **Eastbourne Seafront, East Sussex, UK**

The world's largest free sea front air show.

8/23-25 Tannkosh

Tannheim Airfield, Germany
The European equivalent to EAA AirVenture Oshkosh, Tannkosh attracts hundreds of private aircraft from all over Europe.

8/29-9/1 Bournemouth Air Festival

Bournemouth Seafront, Dorset, UK
Four day festival in August that attracts around 1,300,000 spectators.

9/11-15 Reno Air Races **Reno, Nevada**

Known as the "Worlds Fastest Motor Sport" Features civil air show acts and military flight demonstrations between races.

9/14-15 Southport Air Show **North West of England**

The largest air show in the North West of England featuring all things aviation.

10/4-6 Miramar Air show **San Diego, CA**

The largest military air show in the nation that attracts an estimated 700,000 spectators.

Racer Game


Let's Race em'!

TO PLAY: Print the game board and paper plane templates. Follow the directions to create all six racer planes. **SET THE RACETRACK:** Cut two pieces of masking tape about 48 inches long. Place tape strips along the floor about 20 feet apart indicating one as the start line and one as the finish line. Line up the contestants behind the start line. Have each person throw their paper plane at the same time, the person whose plane crosses the finish line first WINS the round. Place a penny on the game board to indicate the WINNER for that round. Adjust your paper planes and continue to play until all the rounds are complete. The person who crosses the finish line first for four rounds is the WINNER!




